The Milad E. Sherief Memorial College was founded in 1964 with the intention of improving the overall status of the neighbourhood, which was socially, economically, and literarily in a precarious position. Al Haj P.K. Kunju Sahib, whose name was well-known as an educator, legislator, economist, and as a multifaceted personality in practically all aspects of the society, initiated the mission.

The College is affiliated to University of Kerala and followed the curriculum offered by the university. The college offers 8 PG courses 14 UG courses that help students enhance their entrepreneurial and other abilities. The Union Government established the National Service Scheme (NSS) and the National Cadet Corps (NCC) as volunteer organisations. They are educational and training initiatives designed to instill in people a sense of nationalism, patriotism, and fundamental cultural values. The college has an operational unit for both NCC and NSS. The Additional Skill Acquisition Programme Kerala (ASAP), a government-owned organisation, works to increase students' employability and facilitate their placement. ASAP acts as a link between business and higher education. The college is actively involving its stakeholders in the ASAP initiative.

Strategic plans for the future

Increase the College's ability to recognise and respond to community needs by undertaking significant outreach and service projects. In addition to the curriculum, the following will be put into practice.

1. Making SWAYAM/MOOC enrollment mandatory for all PG and final-year UG students.
2. Introducing specialised training programmes for passing the NET and SET exams.
3. The College will improve its systems for assisting students. Remedial teaching programmes have already made some preliminary efforts. These will undergo additional automatization. The variety in our classrooms demands innovative solutions for fostering these distinctions. The College will make every effort to establish itself as a welcoming and equitable venue for the whole student body.
4. Encourage community members to participate in college programmes and activities
5. Expand the possibilities for students, professors, and staff to engage in civic involvement and community service.
6. Offer more opportunities for cultural involvement in the arts, sciences, technology, and other fields on campus and in the neighbourhood.

7. Increase the presence of business and workforce development to meet community and industry demands.

8. In order to develop job prospects for students, strengthen partnerships with the community and business.

The IQAC is responsible for overseeing the strategic plan. The committee will ensure the strategy is implemented and that adequate institutional resources are assigned to carry out the mission-level priorities by holding frequent meetings.

At the same time, it is also acknowledged that the IQAC's primary function will be that of a supervisor. Many of the aforementioned objectives fall under the purview of Committees that already exist. Therefore, the properly created Committees will be used to realise the objectives listed in the Strategic Plan.
