**FLOOD**

The people of Kerala, who were devastated by the catastrophic floods, were once again in distress on August 8. Most of the districts in Kerala received heavy rains. The worst affected areas were Wayanad.



A collection center has been set up at Kayamkulam MSM College, Kayamkulam, Karunagapally and Alappuzha under the auspices of the NSS unit to provide relief and relief to the flood - affected people of Wayanad .Students and teachers collected the required items. Homes, shops, institutions, clothing stores, and the medical store in the vicinity of the college all collected supplies from there.

Many food items, textiles, groceries, dry fruits, cleaning materials, sanitary napkins, mineral water, etc. were received. The NSS volunteers then repackaged each item as food item, stationary, cloth rags, sanitary napkins and medicine rags. That ended the collection at exactly 5 p.m.

On the second day, the collection started from Karunagapally area at 9 am.

Lots of fabrics were received from Thuppassery, Ryan, Lakshmi and Pochayil cloth shops in Karunagapally. First aid kits, Dettol, Lotions and Sanitary Napkins from medical stores. The working group and teachers from there joined.

On the 3rd day, the volunteers collected rice, tea, sugar, salt, brush, paste, soap, biscuits, milk powder and pulses from the area around the volunteers' house and sent them to the college. All the collection done in 3 days was sorted and packed in the college. The program ended at exactly 5 o'clock.

It was a very different experience to be able to give a little help to the brothers in Wayanad who were suffering for food and clothing at one time.

## **Flood Relief Work**





Heavy rainfall caused flood and landslides in many of the districts in Kerala. Hundreds of people were evacuated to safer places and relief camps.



Wayanad district is in dire straits due to floods. In that situation, the MSM College NSS unit decided to lend a helping hand to the children of Wayanad. The study materials including the bags and books of 46 orphans at the "Our Home" orphanage run by Sri Chacko K Mathew at Wayanad Government High School Kottathara and Government LP School Venniyodu, later located at Vaipadi near Kalpetta in Wayanad district were destroyed by the floods. The hostel building was also destroyed. Of the 46, 17 are girls and the rest are boys. Therefore, funding was essential from the very beginning. Initially, NSS volunteers collected books, pens, pencils, instrument boxes and colored pencils from the college. In addition, a good amount of money was received from expatriates and teachers. In addition, books, pens and pencils were provided free of cost by the supermarket. Thus 500 books were collected. Later the bag was collected as part of the English department of the college. All these materials were satisfactorily delivered to the children of Wayanad.





The NSS Volunteers from MSM College started their journey from the college on August 23. On August 24, they reached Wayanad at 10.00 am. Volunteer Secretaries Arun and Bilal and 4 NSS Volunteers accompanied the delegation. Volunteer secretaries went with the materials in the car. The remaining 4 volunteers went on the train. First, they visited SALP school vennyode. There were most of the tribal students studying. Books, pencils, pens and colored pencils were donated to selected students studying in that school. Government High School Kottathara is located at a distance of 2 km near by SALP School. Materials such as books, pens, pencils and instrument boxes were donated to the students of Kottathara School. Then we headed in to the Volunteers Orphanage. "Our Home" was an orphanage run by Mr. Chacko K. Mathew at Vaipadi near Kalpetta. The orphanage was in total crisis. We donated books, bags and pens to the children. We saw their happy faces when they accepted the study materials. It made us even happier.



The biggest achievement we have had from this is that Kottathara School has achieved 100% success in this past SSLC award. We consider each of the volunteers fortunate to have been able to help in the event of a fall at one of the best performing schools in Wayanad district, which has a generally low pass percentage.

## Boundless friendship with Assam



Heavy rains continue in northern India and northeastern states. The death toll from floods in Bihar, Assam and Mizoram has risen to more than 46 lakh in Bihar. Thirty districts in Assam have been evacuated.

As part of the NSS unit at MSM College, Kayamkulam, food, soap, lotion, clothes and medicines were collected from each department under the leadership of Program Officer T. Nishad Sir for the distressed people in Assam. Collected infidels from other colleges.

These were delivered by Bhama and our volunteer secretary Jeansy at 4.15 pm at Kesavadasapuram, Thiruvananthapuram.



It was decided that in the event of another flood, a lot of preparations would have to be made for it and the flood victims would be provided with the necessary assistance and would be with them.

### **Kerala Flood:well testing programme**

All the houses were full of water and they can't go out of their houses for their daily needs and we decided to take a stream to flw the water to the outside . Then they said that their children have allergic problems due to the contaminated water . Then we collected the water from every well and sent them to the labs and we bleached the wells.

After the well testing programme we reached the college at 2:00 pm
